

New Summer Science Internships

This summer, international students are getting hands-on experience in state-ofthe-art laboratories in Israel though our new Summer Science Internship program. your goals in mind – the program is focused on helping students get into excellent Ph.D. programs in the United States and Europe.

Program Director Eyal Winter says ISEE is special in part because you'll get **handson research experience and guidance.** Each participant in the five-week program is "engaging actively in doing research and working on a project of his or her own. Not just studying, but actually innovating," he explains.

Advisors can also help you **develop a competitive application package**, and each student in the program submits a research paper. Winter notes that helps set students' applications apart, giving faculty members "something on which to base an effective letter of recommendation. This is a unique feature of our summer school."

Study Diversity in the "City of Coexistence"

We're launching another exciting new program at HebrewU this summer, in partnership with IFSA Butler: Diversity and Coexistence. This program offers you a **broad perspective on the intersection of identity, religion, community, nationalism, and diversity** – and fresh insight into political and social movements around the world.

"Jerusalem is the perfect place to study diversity," says Hannah Harder, a student in the inaugural class. "This program has If gaining valuable exposure to research methods and connections in your field sounds interesting, consider an internship for next year! You'll earn four academic credits and work under the direct supervision of internationally respected scientists.

You can spend 40 hours per week **contributing to research in medicine, engineering, or the hard sciences** – and you'll complete a final paper or report based on your work. Among the opportunities offered are internships in the fields of neuroscience and psychology, through HebrewU's partnership with the Jerusalem Brain Community.

Seth Gans, a third-year undergraduate student from the University of Colorado, Boulder, is attending RIS and interning under the auspices of the Jerusalem Brain Community in the lab of Prof. Hermona Soreq, Professor of Molecular Neuroscience, The Alexander Silberman Institute of Life Sciences. He notes that "you will gain real experience, on a professional level, and **see what it is really like to work in a world-renowned research lab**" (in interview with Cheryl Cashriel of JBC).

The program is open to senior undergraduate or graduate students, and if you're an exchange student from one of our partner institutions, tuition is waived.
