

This program aims to provide participants with a broad picture of the latest developments in the trauma field. Theories and research pertaining to the consequences of trauma, healthy coping processes and possible pathological consequences will be presented. Students will learn about the risks of developing PTSD, related distress and potential protective factors. Guiding principles for clinical programs treating post-traumatic disorders will be discussed.

The academic curriculum will be enriched by the following experiences:

- A field visit to a city-wide intervention program for strengthening resilience in the civilian population in the wake of war.
- Opportunities to practice experiential techniques for early intervention and treatment of traumatized individuals.
- Presentation of programs that have been implemented in Israel, which are aimed at building resilience and preventing pathological consequences of trauma.

- Clinical interventions

The two-week program is open for professionals and advanced students in Clinical or Educational Psychology, Neuropsychology, Social Work, Psychiatry, Counseling, Nursing, Medicine, Law and Public Health, as well as civil servants and clergy.
