Required Essay

During registration students are required to write a short essay as part of the classification process, unless they are complete beginners (i.e., have no knowledge of the Hebrew). Please go to room 302 in the Boyar Building after you are done registering to write your essay (Monday, July 1) as early as possible, so that by tomorrow morning you will be placed in a class that suits your level and abilities.

Purchasing the Hebrew textbook

Students in Level Aleph Bet and Gimel will purchase the textbook together, so you do not have to buy the textbook in advance.

Level Aleph - עברית מן ההתחלה, חלק א' - Hebrew from Scratch, Part 1- has a yellow cover Level Bet- עברית מן ההתחלה, חלק ב' - Hebrew from Scratch, Part 2 - has a red cover Level Gimel – עושים עניין

Please do not write in the book until you and your teacher are sure that your class assignment is correct. You will be able to exchange the book in the bookstore as long as you do not write in it.

Finding your Class

All classes are held in the Boyar Building on the Mount Scopus campus.

You will be notified by email (the e-mail address in our system) as to your class placement a day prior to the start of the ulpan. If you do not receive an e-mail, please go to the 5th floor (rooms 501-2) to complete registration, and then to the Hebrew offices (rooms 444-447) to receive a note and your class placement.

Participation

- The final grade of those who miss 30% or more of their classes will be based on 70% of their final exam grade in the Ulpan.
